PONTIS	<p>Short report from the May activity – Generation 3.0 Awards event</p> <p>Our strategic project Generation 3.0 aims to support innovations in the Slovak education system from the bottom-up. We want to promote the concept of Education 3.0 - "Education by anyone and anywhere". Whereas Education 2.0 is using digital technology in the classroom, Education 3.0 aims to enhance learning anywhere, and isn't confined by the premises of learning institutions. In this blog we connect our mission to Sustainable Development Goals and Agenda 2030 - educating the new generation that will enter job market in a more globalized and automatized world.</p> <p>During the event of the Generation 3.0 Award on 3 May 2018, awarded NGOs and schools in 5 categories, and we also had speakers that brought international and global perspective related to Sustainable Development Goals. Vicky Colbert was our key note speaker and she talked about her experience as a founder of Escuela Nueva – an innovation of rural and community schools that spread from Colombia to many other countries. Vicky Colbert is a winner of Yidan Prize 2017 and an Ashoka Fellow. Before the event she also held a lecture at Comenius University.</p> <p>The second keynote speaker was Roni Zarom, the founder of Unistream. They create startup hubs for secondary school students from the periphery towns of Israel with the focus on disadvantaged communities. Students there learn after school in great premises that look like some exclusive co-working centers and compete in their startup ideas.</p> <p>Both speakers talked about the importance of global cooperation and exchange of ideas and innovation in order to improve the state of education in the world and they talks were very connected to SDGs.</p>
